Once enrolled in a class, students are able to get their Instructional Permits after completing only 4 hours of classroom. Must be at least 15 years old to qualify and pass the written test at the driver's license facility.

The State of Illinois requires teens to hold their permit for a minimum period of 9 months. Getting their permit as early as they can allows them more time on the road to practice. The more practice they get gives them more experience before getting their driver's license.

Teens have busy lives; with heavy school work loads, sports, jobs and extra circular activities it limits the amount of free time. We offer a variety of classes to fit each schedule. **Many classes are offered several times a week and on the weekends for additional convenience.**

The Behind the Wheel portion of the program is offered 7 days a week. For added convenience, pick-up and drop-off is also offered at no additional cost (some restrictions may apply).
